

Using Bubble Jet Set 2000

NOTE: These directions do not replace the directions on the bottle.
Be sure to read them carefully

Step 1 -

Gather your supplies

- 100% cotton or silk (pre-washed)
- Bubble Jet Set Solution
- Container w/ flat bottom
- Freezer Paper
- Object to put picture on



Step 2

- Cut fabric into 9x13 blocks
- Place in bottom of container
- Cover with Bubble Jet Set making sure everything is completely wet
- Wait 5 minutes.



Step 3

- Hang to drip dry
- Do NOT wring fabric



Step 4

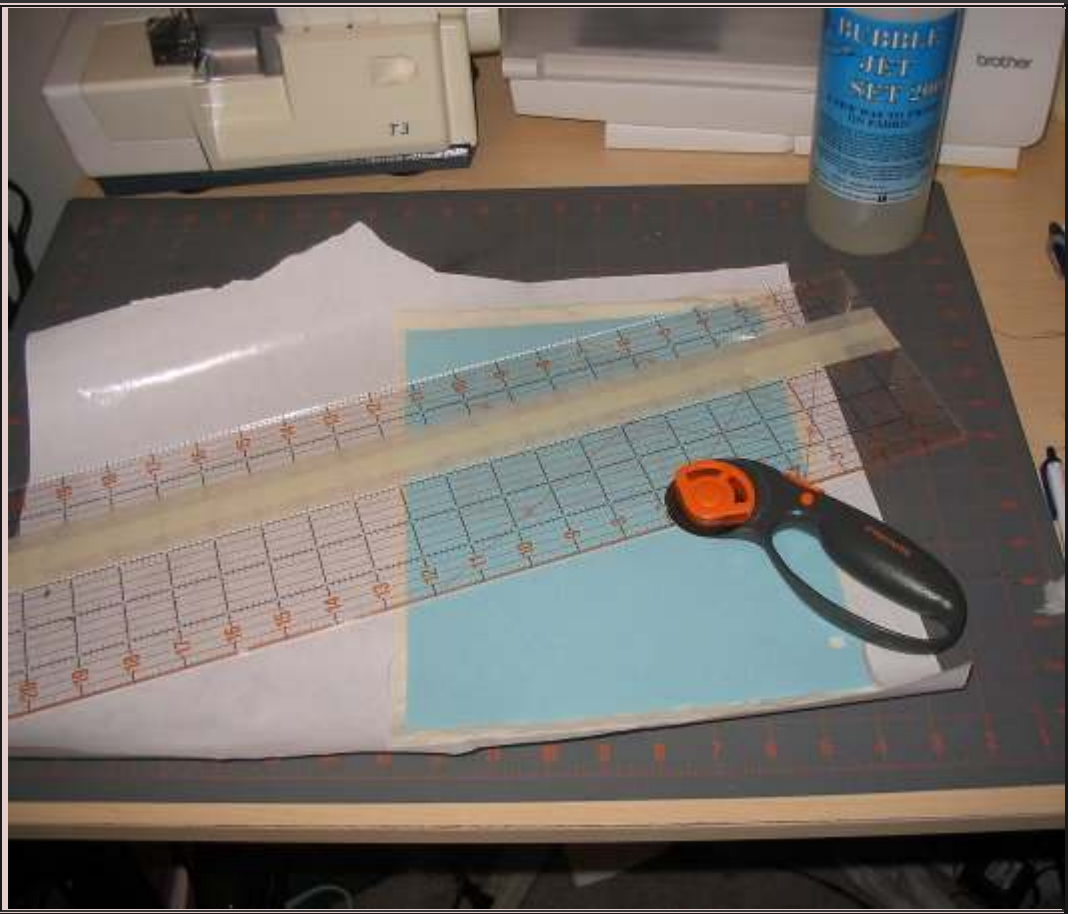
- After completely dry lay on shiny side of freezer paper and iron to adhere fabric to paper
- Making sure all edges are secured to paper
- This gives the fabric enough stiffness to go through your printer



Step 5

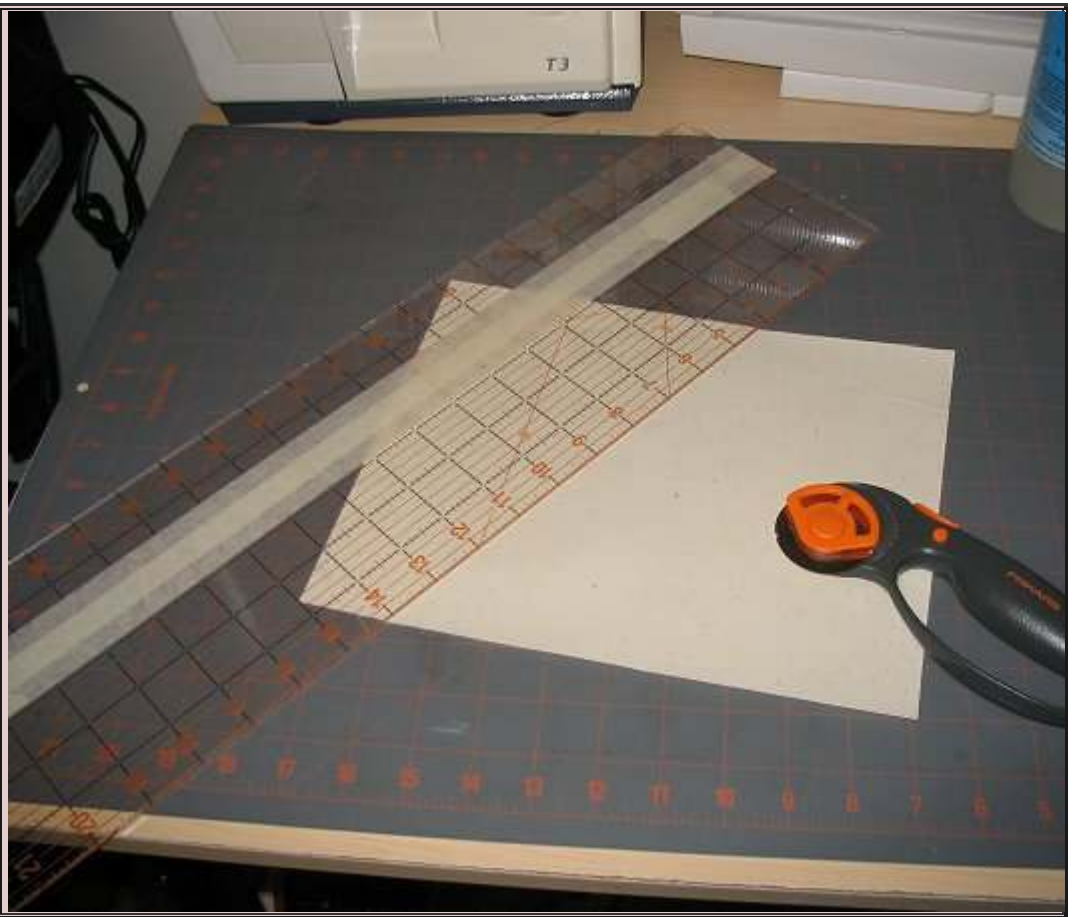
- Using a sheet of paper as a guide, cut fabric to 8.5"x11"
- I also use a straight edge and rotary cutter.

Note: You can use any size paper. I am using a full sheet.



Step 6

Make sure all edges are secured to paper



Step 7

- Place fabric sheet into printer
- Select your picture
- Printer settings
 - best quality
 - glossy photo paper setting usually works best



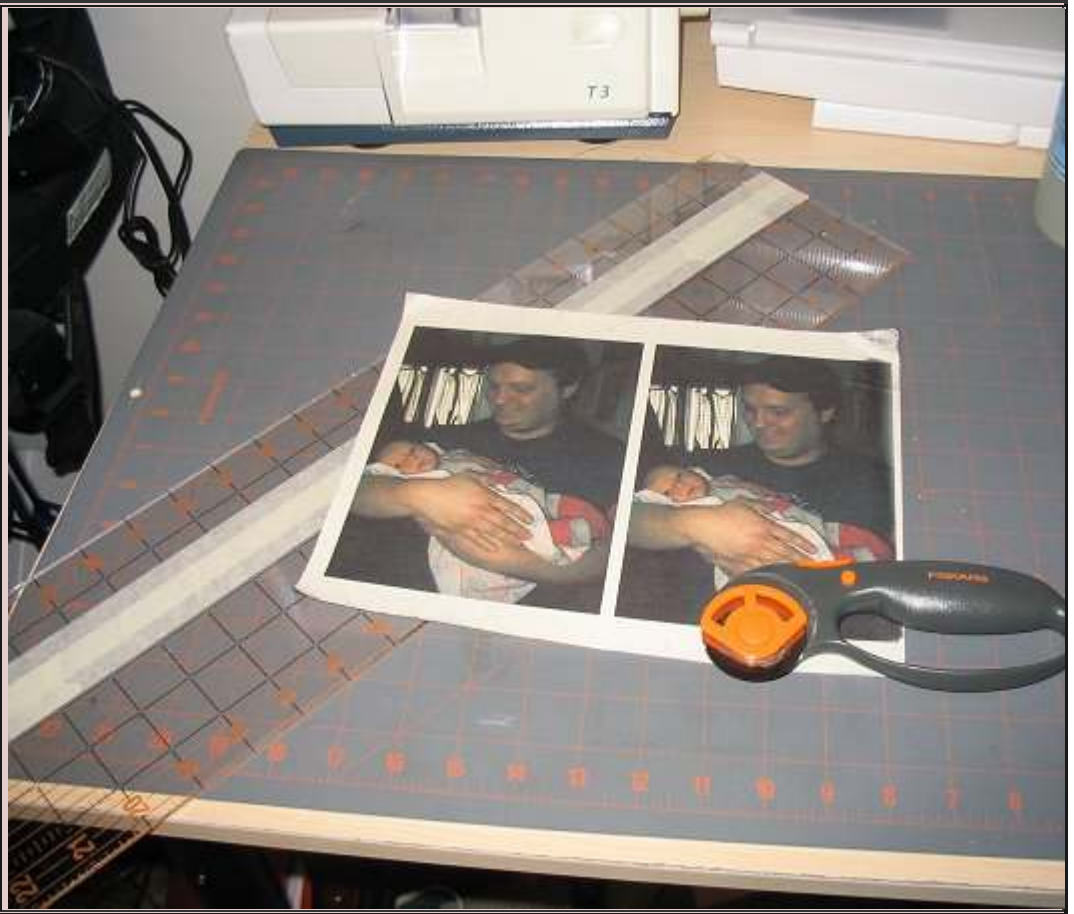
Step 8

- Print your picture onto your fabric



Step 9

- Let rest for at least 30 minutes
- Trim to desired shape



Step 10

- Choose where you want your newly printed picture to go.

I have chosen a shirt for my StepFather for my Father's Day.

- (If desired) use a bonding agent to hold picture in place
- Stitch with a close zigzag around all sides of picture

If you wish.. now embroider on the item.



Final Step

Wash in **COLD** water with mild detergent.

Yes, you must use detergent or the image will fade too quickly.

There is a Bubble Jet Set Rinse that is recommended.

Preferred method of rinsing - full tub of cold water and only the one piece of fabric.
