

## Directions for footwarmers.

Men:

Rice bag, I use ticking it is heavier and lasts longer with the rice.

Measurements: 11 1/2 inches X 13 1/2 inches. Cut on the fold.

With wrong sides together sew all open sides leaving an opening for turning. Turn right side out. Fill approximately 2/3 full of rice. Sew opening closed.

Boot: Piece #1- Measurements: 12 1/2 X 14 1/2 inches. Mark center and round outer corners on the toe end of boot. (Just the corners get rounded).

Piece #2- Measurements: 12 1/2 X 18 1/2 inches. Mark center and round corners same as piece #1.

Piece #3- Measurements: Here you have to do some drawing.

This piece is somewhat triangularly shaped. I hope that I don't confuse you. 16 inches across the bottom.

Angle up 7 1/2 inches. Measure 12 inches wide.

Then round the outer corners making the finished toe 11 inches across.

This piece is cut on the fold. If you mark the center in the beginning, it makes measuring the toe area easier.

Assembly: Stack all of the pattern pieces on top of each other so that when turned right side out, piece #3 is on top. Piece #1 is folded back on itself to make it just a tinsy bit longer than Piece #2 to accommodate the rice bag. Now stitch around the left side, toe, and right side leaving the bottom open (this is where #1 is folded). Turn right side out, insert rice bag and you have a finished footwarmer. If you want to embroider on #3, do that before assembly.

Womans foot warmer: Rice bag: 11 1/2 X 11 1/2 inches. Assemble same as mens.

Boot: Piece #1: 12 1/2 X 16 1/2 inches. Same as for mens. Round toes.

Piece #2: 12 1/2 X 12 1/2 inches. Same as for mens. Round toes.

Piece #3: 16 X 11 inches X 7 inches tall. Place this piece on the fold. Same as for mens. Round toes.

\*Be sure to mark the center of all pattern pieces. It makes stacking so much easier. Pattern piece #3 will be crumpled in the middle when you stack them all together. Be sure to align the sides evenly when stacking pieces. This allows room for the feet to get into the boot.

I hope that I haven't confused you, this really is simple and goes together very quickly.
